#### Restoration of Roberts Memorial in Passage West

Captain Roberts captained the Cork ship 'Sirius which was the first steamer to cross the Atlantic from Cobh in 1838. A memorial was erected to his memory in the churchyard in Passage West, on the four sides of which were depictions of the ships he had commanded: *Black Joke, Sirius, British Queen*, and *President*.
