The Rector writes...

Dear friends

I hope very much that you have managed to enjoy the summer – so far! As we enter the harvest season, we have an opportunity to look back and give thanks for the many blessings in our lives. One of those blessings is our church community – and, of course, our beautiful church buildings and grounds, which not only hold many memories but continue to be places where we gather to pray and mark the important moments in our lives.

I want to take this opportunity to mention some events that are coming up in September...

Sunday School

Sunday School will begin again on Sunday 8th September. Thereafter, it will be held on the third Sunday of the month until further notice.

Sausage Service

The first Sausage service of the autumn will be at 5pm on Sunday 15th September.

Harvest Services

Frankfield will hold their harvest services on Sunday 15th in the morning services.

Passage will hold their harvest service in the evening at 7pm.

And Douglas will hold their harvest service on Sunday 29th September at 11am. This will also be a united service.

Blackrock's harvest service will be on 22nd September at 11.30am.

United Service

At this service we will be looking ahead to St Luke's 150th birthday next year in 2025. It will very much be a celebration of our life together and a looking ahead to the possibilities for 2025. In this sense, it will be something of a vision service. The pandemic hit many parishes hard – and we too felt the effects on parish life. The social side of our parish was hit especially hard. We will want to continue the process of building up our parish community. Together with the Select Vestry, our hope and prayer are that we can make 2025 a year of special services and events to celebrate our life together.

And, of course, at the heart of our life together is our worship. We recently read the story of King Solomon consecrating the Temple he built in Jerusalem (1 Kings 8). This was to be the place where God's presence would dwell with the people on earth. No expense was spared to make it as beautiful as possible – in itself an act of worship. St Luke's might not quite match Solomon's temple(!) but, for us, it is a very special place, and it is the focus for our worship and holds many memories. As with all our churches in the parish union, these are the places where we mark the momentous events of our lives – as well as inhabiting and celebrating the Christian year.
