Dear Friends

Lent begins this month. But what is Lent and what are we supposed to do? The word Lent comes from the Old English lencten, meaning "spring," referencing the time of year when Lent occurs. In our Western Christian tradition, Lent is a season of self-examination, penitence, self-denial, study, and preparation for Easter, to which almsgiving has traditionally been added.

It can be difficult to find time to devote to these practices – and it is especially difficult to do this on our own. This year, I am delighted that Rev Meghan Farr will be leading us in our Lent course – The Story of Scripture. Meghan will show us how the bible fits together and tells us one big story. We will be holding 5 successive Wednesday evenings. These will start in the Canon Packham Hall for light refreshments, followed by a multi-media presentation and time for questions and discussion in the school hall where there are some excellent audio-visual facilities! The first evening is on Wednesday 12th March at 7.30pm. We will finish each evening by 9pm. Everyone welcome. It will be accessible for all levels of understanding.

If anyone would like to be part of a hospitality team that would be wonderful. Please let me know. It will involve arriving a little bit earlier and making teas and coffee – and bringing something simple like biscuits or cake to offer to other guests. Michele deFoubert - In Memory

Michele, my wife of just six years and my best friend of twenty-two years, sadly died suddenly on June 3rd, 2024. Michele was so loved by so many – Not least, by the 120 members of the Fleischmann choir of the MTU Cork School of Music. She was a member of that choir from its foundation in 1992. After Michele's death, three members of the Fleischmann choir and dear friends of hers felt the need to do



something in her memory. The concept of creating a perpetual trophy in her name to be gifted to the Cork School of Music seemed the answer. A fundraising drive began and between the choir members and friends, over four thousand euro was raised. It was decided that a unique sterling silver trophy should be created. Ali Cullinane, one of the three members driving the project, was tasked with designing the silver trophy and O'Carroll silver smiths with its creation.

On Monday 20th January, the Cork School of Music hosted an evening to mark the presentation of the Michele de Foubert perpetual trophy to the school management, to be awarded annually to the highest achieving student in BMus or voice. Michele's memory will now live on in the life of the Cork School of Music and the lives of Corks music students into the future.
